Economic Outlook Holds Steady


Optimism among small firms edged downward in October due to renewed concerns about the strength of the economic expansion. The WSJ/Vistage Small Business Confidence Index was 109.0 in the October 2014 survey, just below the 110.8 recorded in September, while remaining well above last October's 97.0. Importantly, since the start of 2014, the Confidence Index has shown mostly small and insignificant variations about its mean of 108.8. Moreover, most of those small changes were due to shifting perceptions of the overall economy. Financial market volatility and weaker growth prospects for Europe and Asia have slightly dimmed the domestic economic outlook, but most small firms did not believe those issues would have much influence on their own businesses.

When firms were asked about prospects for their own business, they were generally as positive, or a bit more optimistic, as they were six months ago. Rather than worrying about weaker sales growth, CEOs were more concerned about making new investments to expand their productive capacity and their firm's ability to retain and attract more employees. Indeed, three-in-four small businesses reported that they would raise the base wages for their lowest paid workers over the next six to twelve months.
